So far, our little ones have celebrated National Tree Day and NAIDOC Week, explored bubble art, planted and cared for vegetables, fruit and flowers, and more. With regular visits from Wildlings Forest School, our kids are enjoying reading books about nature, creating nature craft, learning how to saw safely, and more. And there are excursions, Book Week and Pyjama Day to still to come.

There will be fun for parents and carers this term too! The Staverton Gala on 10 September is themed Havana Nights and will be fun for all. Get your babysitters booked and we look forward to seeing you there

Welcome to Term 3! I would like to start by thanking the Fundraising Team for the fantastic movie night they organised towards the end of the last term. It was a wonderful night enjoyed by many and we managed to raise \$1034.30 for the kindergarten. Thank you to all who attended and supported the event!

We have our largest fundraising event of the year to look forward to in September, the Gala! I encourage you all to come along as it's always a fantastic night. We have great prizes and auction items on offer and it's a wonderful opportunity to engage with other parents and carers, and of course, our teaching staff who will be there to also enjoy the night together.

Our exciting new playground is on track to begin installation in September. The committee and I are currently working on completing the risk assessment and will shortly be providing some information to families detailing exactly how the construction process will be undertaken and managed.

The executive team and I have been working hard to understand how the new funding arrangement for sessional kindergartens that was announced last term will impact Staverton next year. I want to thank our Treasurer Johan and the admin team for working through the financial modelling and budgeting required, in consultation with Lady Gowrie, to ensure that the kindy remains in a good financial position next year. The good news for families is that kindy will be cheaper next year, thanks to a government initiative aiming to increase the uptake of 4-year-old kindy enrolments across the state. We are awaiting the release of the kindy calculator by the government which will allow families to understand exactly how much cheaper it will be for them and are expecting this release date sometime in late August-September.

In other news, I'm thrilled to announce that we've been successful in obtaining some more sponsorship for the kindy. I'd like to acknowledge and thank Cameron Crouch and his team at Ray White Sherwood/Graceville for coming on as our major sponsor. We are so grateful for their contribution to the kindy and look forward to working together throughout the year. You may see them assisting with some of our events in the future, which will be wonderful and much appreciated.

I hope you and your child are all enjoying the term so far and are looking forward to all the exciting incursions and excursions planned. I look forward to seeing you all around the kindy and please reach out if you have any questions/concerns throughout the term.



We have had a much nicer start to this term, and I certainly hope this continues. Term 3 is packed with fun things and should be a great one! Illness

COVID of course continues to be a problem for our community, and we do have several family members impacted by this virus currently. I will continue to inform the families when a positive COVID case has attended kindy during their infectious period.

I wish to thank all of you for informing me promptly of any symptoms and for keeping your children home - I know it isn't easy. Staff continue to work with children each day on hygiene and how to reduce the spread of germs. The vaccination and mask mandate has been lifted.

Program

- This term we have the Wildlings Forest School attending for an incursion every Wednesday. This excellent program will help foster our love of nature play.
- Uncle Robert has visited us again and taught the children a traditional Torres Strait Islander song.
- We are going on an excursion to the Corinda Library, taking the train, to enhance our love of books during book week.
- Each class will have a PJ day during book week (what a great start to the morning!) to
 enjoy that snuggly feeling of curling up with a book.
- Staverton will have a stall at the Graceville State School fete aka Spring Fair on Saturday, August 27. We will have activities available including nature crafts and flower crowns and we would love some volunteers to help us run this please from 10am - 4pm.
- Children continue to be interested in nature play, bush medicine, Aboriginal culture, building cubbies and forts, cooking, woodwork, gardening, and tools.
- The staff have started considering transition statements and will commence preparing these soon.
- We are also working with the executive committee and Lady Gowrie with regards to the new kindergarten funding for 2023 and what this means for Staverton.
- Brooke, our Lady Gowrie consultant, will be visiting on Tuesday, 2 August and Thursday, 8 September.

 The RAP working group helped prepare how Staverton would recognise Sorry Day and how we would celebrate NAIDOC week. I think the children have many opportunities to learn about and celebrate Indigenous cultures.

- The SMP working hasp have created a lovely community garden for the children to look
 after and the families to take little bits from we hope you enjoy this. Staverton has been
 nominated for a Waste Smart Brisbane Award. The children love eco-warriors and
 attending to the compost, turning the lights on and off, learning about power, natural
 resources, and sustainability.
- AEDC data group is excited as this data has just been released (it's only released every
 three years). This gives a great breakdown of the general strengths and weaknesses of
 children in our area and allows kindergartens and schools to tailor their programs to help
 our children in the appropriate ways. The local schools and kindies have established "The
 Oxley Rd Early Years Network" and they aim to meet once per term to discuss this date
 and also topical issues for our area.


AKHC and Vacation Care
